2023-24 SESSION IN REVIEW

It has been a busy legislative session in Harrisburg! During the spring and summer, I took part in state budget hearings as a member of the House Appropriations Committee. Those hearings provided me with an opportunity to ask state agency leaders key questions about their funding requests and advocate for the responsible use of taxpayer dollars.

I also had language from three of my bills signed into law with several others receiving consideration and advancing through the legislative process. **Acts 53** and **17**, containing the language I offered, were signed into law in 2023; and this year, **Act 54 of 2024** was signed with an initiative I put forward regarding workers compensation reimbursement.

I remain committed to working on legislation that promotes the responsible stewardship of taxpayer dollars, ensures our state's fiscal health and incentivizes people to plant roots in Pennsylvania.



\$13.25 MILLION AWARDED for Community Investments

State grant funding plays a critical role in funding community and economic development projects. I am pleased to announce that I've played a role in securing over \$13.25 million from various state grant programs, which will be invested right here in the 87^{th} District.

I recently advocated for \$3.7 million from the Local Share Account (LSA) and Public School Facility Improvement Grant (PSFIG) programs; \$9.5 million from the Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP); and \$250,000 from the Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) Community Conservation Partnership Program (C2P2).

The dollars from these programs were awarded to a wide variety of projects, including infrastructure and school building improvements, economic development initiatives and more.
